

Title IX

The U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights (OCR) enforces Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972. Title IX protects people from discrimination based on sex in education programs or activities that receive federal financial assistance. Title IX states:

No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.

Sexual harassment and sexual discrimination is defined as unwelcomed conduct determined by a reasonable person to be so severe, pervasive, and objectively offensive that it effectively denies a person equal access to the school's education program or activity.

The Baker County School District will not discriminate nor tolerate harassment of any kind in its educational programs or activities. In any case of sexual discrimination or harassment allegation, the school board designated Robin Mobley as the Title IX coordinator. She can be contacted at:
